Chino Valley Town Council cancels meeting after snowstorm

Items on agenda to be moved to future meeting

Amid the quad-city area's largest snowstorm since 2019 that made many roads unsafe to travel, the Town of Chino Valley opted to cancel its town council meeting that was scheduled to take place Tuesday, Jan. 26.

Chino Valley Mayor Jack Miller said the town thought it was best to cancel the meeting not only because the roads were covered in snow and ice, but also because the meeting itself was projected to be a brief one anyway. All items on the agenda for the canceled meeting will be moved to a future meeting, but it is still undetermined which meeting they will be moved to.

Chino Valley residents warned by police after COVID vaccine scam calls circulate in area

Within the past couple of weeks, Ruth Wheeler of Chino Valley said she received three calls from three different numbers, each time someone offering her the COVID-19 vaccine at a sooner date for \$100 in cash.

Wheeler said the people on the other end of each line were men, but none of them specified what agency, department or company he was calling from. They all told her that she could receive a coronavirus vaccine shot if she paid \$100 in cash, but since she already suspected that it was a scam, Wheeler didn't entertain the call for long, and hung up each time.

The First Step



Chino Valley schools hold COVID-19 vaccination clinic for teachers, administration

The first step in getting students and teachers back in the classroom safely was finally taken as the Chino Valley Unified School District held a COVID-19 vaccination clinic for all of its staff members Wednesday, Jan. 27, at Heritage Middle School.

Just one day after the quad-city area was hit with the biggest snowstorm since 2019's "Snowmagedden," CVUSD

staff members took time out of their distance-learning day and went down to the Heritage Middle School gym to receive the first dose of the long-anticipated Moderna vaccine.

Partnering with Yavapai County Education Service Agency (YCESA), the district was able to offer early doses of the vaccine after Gov. Doug Ducey prioritized educators in phase 1B of the COVID-19 vaccination distribution.

Chino Valley workers put in long hours to plow roads after last week's snowstorm

Amid last week's snowstorm, Chino Valley Public Works Department director Frank Marbury said the town was on top of removing snow from its main arterial roads (Road 1 North, Road 2 North, Road 3 North, Road 4 North, Road 5 North Center Street, Reed Road, and Perkinsville).

A crew of four employees worked 14- to 16-hour shifts since early Jan. 25, and into the following day, plowing snow from the roads while applying cinders and ice melt to the slick areas and stop signs. The town did not enlist or contract any outside help from other organizations or municipalities, Marbury said.
