Catalyst for curbing theft

2 Senate bills target stealing, resale of catalytic converters

When Clint Fink started up his Toyota Prius on March 14, he immediately knew something was wrong.

"It sounded like a monster truck," Fink said. "I thought something was going to blow up."

The Henderson man said he then looked underneath the vehicle and saw a wire

dangling in the middle of the exhaust system, and thought, "Oh, they got me."

Fink had just become a victim of a crime rapidly increasing throughout the Las Vegas Valley — and across the country. His catalytic converter had been stolen.

Catalytic converters, which are part of a car's exhaust system, have become a frequent target of thieves

because of the value of the precious metals — palladium and platinum — in them and the relative ease with which they can be accessed and stolen.

The Metropolitan Police Department said it doesn't track the number of catalytic converter thefts, but according to Carfax, as many as
